OBI Active 8 – December 2018 Portfolio Update

Investment Objective

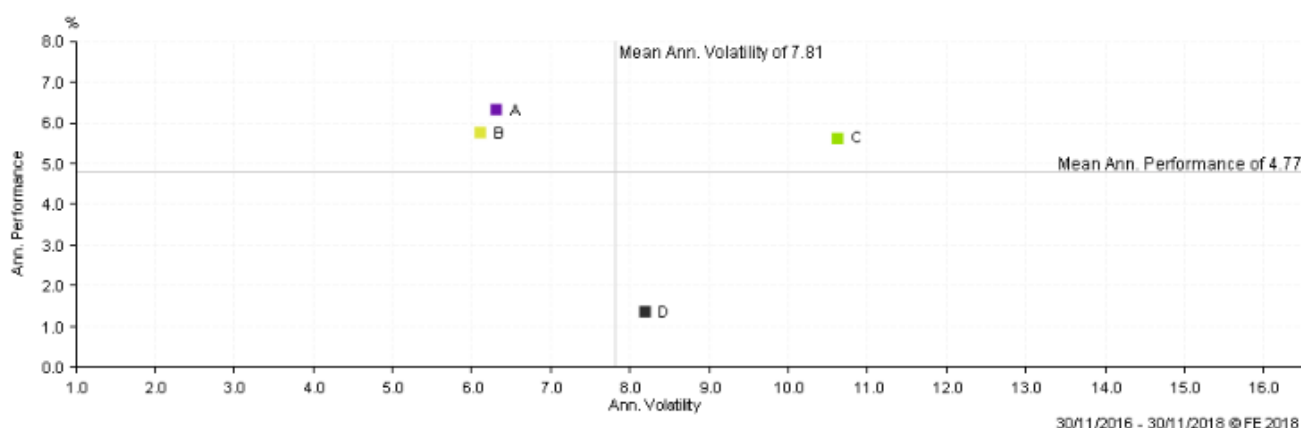
This portfolio is NOT a risk-free portfolio, rather, it is suitable for a client whose is prepared to invest into equities for most of the time and is focused more on the return than the risk, hoping that by doing this they can achieve greater medium-term returns. The portfolio is managed dynamically by altering the asset allocation using assets that carry market risk and using all assets that are available from the investment universe. The asset allocation in this portfolio will vary between a benchmark of 0% equity and 85% equity to achieve the portfolio objectives, provided economic conditions permit. The portfolio will be managed to try and limit the **indicative capital loss in any 12-month period to 18% following a significant event and 9% in normal market conditions** and to target an **annualised total return averaged out over a full economic cycle (5 – 7 years) of 9% before any adviser, custodian, switch and/or discretionary investment management fees, but after fund manager charges.**

The benchmark we use for comparison purposes for volatility is the **AFI Balanced**, which currently holds **68.04% in Equity (Analytics 1st December 2018)**. This benchmark is therefore more aggressive than OBI Active 8 and unlike the model, it does not have a capital preservation mandate. Given the lower equity allocation, the benchmark is unlikely to outperform the model and the volatility of the benchmark would be lower. The model performance therefore cannot be directly compared to the benchmark.

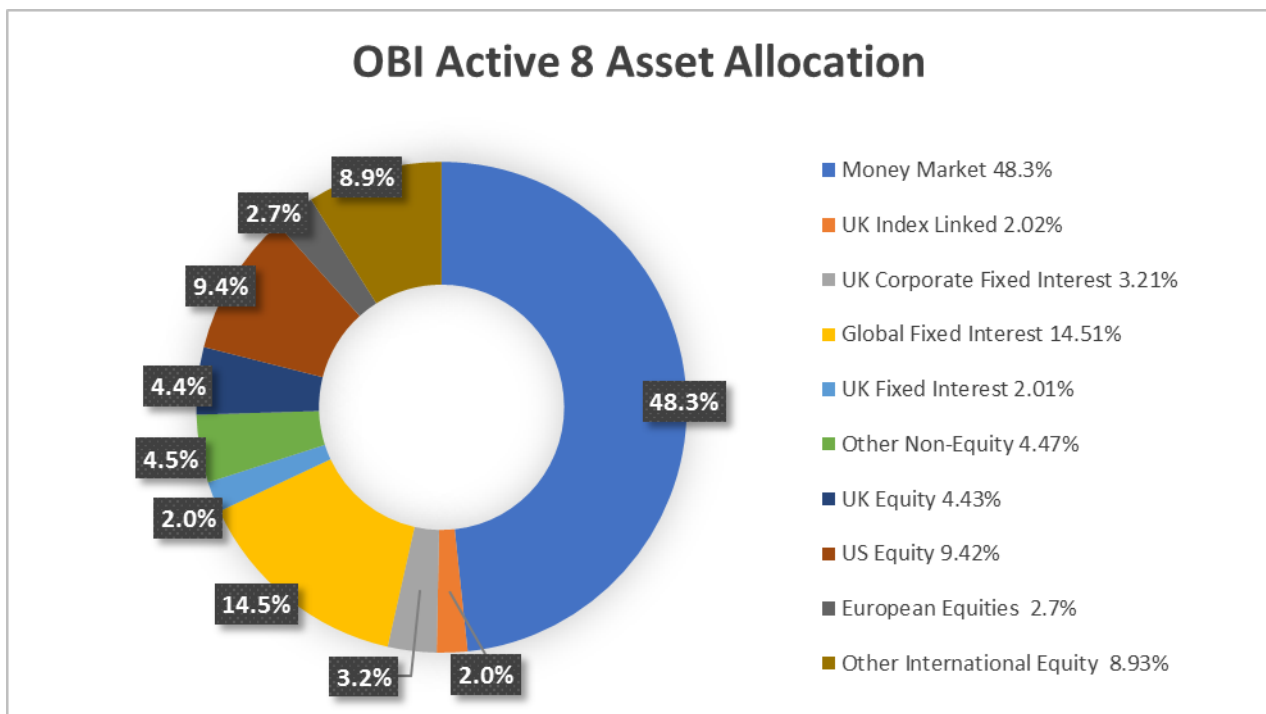

Outlook & Positioning

OBI Active 8 is the most aggressive main stream balanced portfolio that is still considered balanced with regards to the underlying asset allocation, which can vary anywhere between 0% and 85% noting it tends to average about 65% and only spends short periods of time at the highest asset allocation. As with all our portfolios, the mandate is balanced between delivering the outcome and protecting capital, noting this portfolio will spend longer than any other invested in risky assets and will therefore be the most volatile. Global financial markets saw synchronised growth through 2017. Financial markets have been tested and unstable into 2018 which high risks in the equity markets. The US economy has been leading the way with synchronised growth and growth in 2018 with the US markets leading the way with strong company earnings, fundamentals and economic data. As we end 2018, it is apparent that volatility is back as investors remain cautious of the end of the cycle and take profits at each sell off, which exacerbates the drop. We have now taken a high cash strategy which is largely attributed to the high risks and volatility in the markets. As the global economic cycle continues, markets are reaching record highs and investors are cautious after the volatility seen in February and October. Market risks are high as global PMIs start slowing down and corporate earnings are reducing

Our non-equity exposure is achieved through Absolute Return, Strategic & Corporate Bonds, High Yield and Multi Asset funds. In our recent rebalance, we moved the portfolios to something that has lower market sensitivity, so the holdings are now measured using volatility-based equity and non-equity holdings. From an equity perspective, most of the asset allocation is achieved through a high exposure to globally managed funds with directional exposure to markets which we believe show upward growth. The remaining assets are held in globally diverse funds which will be tactically rotated by the underlying fund managers with a 25% directional asset allocation to UK, Europe and Asia. We will remain underweight UK until we see better data and stability in the underlying UK economy.

In terms of our equity allocation, we are holding circa 25.48% in equities which is 42.56% less than the benchmark. We would expect this to fluctuate during 2019 as we take profits and only repurchase again following periods of volatility and falling valuations, in line with the mandate of the portfolio. Following this, we will rotate lesser performing assets from within the non-equity sector and add to our equity allocation.
