Objective

This portfolio is NOT a risk-free portfolio, rather, it is suitable for a client who requires stability of capital and is prepared to accept small levels of capital losses when markets are falling, based on the higher non-equity asset allocation. The portfolio is managed dynamically by altering the asset allocation and by predominantly using low-risk assets that carry market risk and using all assets that are available from the investment universe. The asset allocation within this portfolio will vary between a benchmark of 0% equity and 45% equity on average to achieve the portfolio objectives, provided economic conditions permit. The portfolio will be managed to try and limit the indicative capital loss in any rolling 12-month period to 8% in a significant event and 5% in normal market conditions and to target an annualised total return averaged out over an economic cycle (usually 5 - 7 years) of 5% per annum before any adviser, custodian, switch and/or discretionary investment management fees, but after fund manager charges. Despite the higher allocation in non-equity assets, these asset classes are in some cases becoming riskier than equity assets, however we feel that the current positioning is acceptable when we consider our mandate regarding a client's capital loss acceptance.

Management

The benchmark we use for comparison purposes for volatility is AFI Cautious noting that this benchmark currently holds 51.13% in Equity (Analytics, 3rd May 2021) and is therefore more aggressive than this portfolio. The benchmark also has no capital preservation mandate. It would therefore be expected that this benchmark would outperform the model and that the volatility of the benchmark would be higher. The model performance therefore cannot be directly compared to the benchmark.



Outcome Based Investing

At OCM, we believe that assets in a client portfolio should be adjusted through each phase of the economic cycle.

In line with the OBI strategy, at the extreme point when the cycle is at its most extended and the economies are overheating, it is our view that by moving defensively and focusing on the core portfolio assets, we are able to provide the desired outcome with the least amount of expected volatility.

The key with the strategy of "Outcome Based Investing" is to limit the surprises and capture as much of the upside as possible, with a focus on delivering the client's strategised outcome.

Market Outlook


Having started the year on strong footing, the majority of global regions have seen their economic fundamentals continue to improve as vaccination rates and policy stimulus help to drive upward revisions in economic data. The UK and US have been leaders in the inoculation efforts since January, and Europe's vaccination efforts have surged over the past month, helping to support the forecast of an economic boom later this year. Although the improving outlook contributed to the acceleration in government bond yields in February and March, yields thereafter remained stable in April, helping to mitigate investor concerns over future rises in interest rates. As April came to a close, global investors increasingly drew their attention to the Federal Reserve, principally focusing on the policy maker's inflation expectations and potential policy response. With the recent events considered our economic outlook remains strong, and we see the economic data continuing to improve as policy makers remain accommodative concurrently.

As long-term investors, we have viewed many of the market movements in 2021 as short-term noise, with no changes to our underlying assumptions on the global recovery and market outlook. Looking further ahead, although it is clear that volatility remains in the short-term as early cycle dynamics unfold, we remain optimistic and continue to see opportunities arising as the outlook improves, with global growth remaining well supported by governments and central banks. ESG investments appear set to benefit strongly from accelerating consumer and investor trends over 2021. Governments and corporates are using the recovery to align their strategies with green, social and sustainable financing goals. The shift is at the forefront of investors' minds, with record sums from institutional and retail investors flowing into sustainable investment funds since the start of 2020.

ESG Focus & Positioning

By putting the ESG criteria at the centre of our investment process, we look to deliver robust outcomes for our clients while also actively contributing to a fairer, more sustainable world. After experiencing strong performance in 2020, our outlook remains positive and unchanged in terms of growth and return expectations moving forward. The portfolio has been constructed with a key focus on sustainability, with a high level of diversification in terms of asset classes and geographies, with a mix of bond, equity, and property exposure to meet portfolio objectives over the long term. The bond exposure is gained through high quality, actively manged strategic bond funds while the equity exposure within the portfolio is gained through exposure to diverse, globally managed funds.

Portfolio Volatility



This scatter chart reflects annualised volatility and return in GBP over the past 4 years. Over the long term, we would expect the portfolio to exhibit a lower level of volatility than the benchmark.
